2022 Highlights

2022 was a year of rebuilding and reconnecting as we re-opened the shelter (in July), resumed in-person meetings, and participated in events again.

At the shelter, shelter improvements including a new critter room and remodeled colony care area were completed. Staffing changes included a new Shelter Manager and implementation of an Executive Director position, and a new volunteer bookkeeper. Knowing that the care of the animals was in good hands, volunteers, businesses and the community came forward and provided the necessary income.

^{*}Returns are animals brought back to the shelter within one week. CASA always welcomes back animals that have been adopted, no matter the time limit. CASA takes strays and impounds from Camano Island, surrenders from Camano Island and surrounding counties, and we also bring in dogs and cats from other shelters as space permits.

As a No-Kill shelter, CASA never *PTS - puts animals to sleep for convenience or lack of space. The deaths last year included underage kittens some of whom died in foster care, others who arrived gravely injured and other cats and dogs that had to be put to sleep because they were terminally ill and in the final stages of their illnesses. *DOA - deceased animal brought to the shelter. CASA partners with local rescue groups to find homes for animals who are difficult to place or who need more than the shelter can provide.

Financials at a Glance

Operating Income

Program: Includes dog and cat service fees and Island County contract. Income higher in 2022 due to increased animal intakes.

Other: Includes contributions, fundraising, memorials, and grants. Income higher in 2022 due to a one time National fundraising challenge and resuming major fundraising activities.

Operating Expenses

Program: Includes dog and cat veterinary visits, medical procedures, surgeries, microchips, food, litter. Expenses were higher because of increased animal intakes and increases in medical costs (spays, neuters, medications, lab testing, and surgeries).

Staffing: Wages, taxes and L&I insurance for staff. Staff wages increased in keeping with WA state wages in order to attract and keep quality staff. Addition of new Executive Director also increased staffing expenses.

Other: Includes facilities and equipment expenses, fundraising expenses, fees, office supplies, utilities, insurance, tax preparer fee.


